## PHILADELPHIA

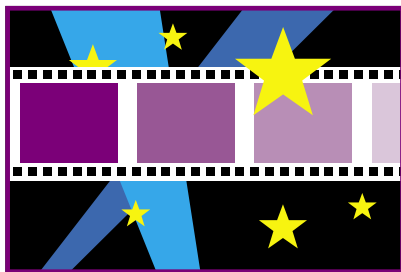
Starring Tom Hanks (Best Actor Oscar) and Denzel Washington

# Social Action

## Sustainable Grounds

The Sustainable Grounds project has been plugging along behind the scenes for the past couple of months. Sue Fera and Connie Springer did a plant audit to determine what we already have and to classify them in terms of water use. Check out the bulletin board for a plot plan showing the results. The good news is that we already have some drought tolerant and even some native plants. We will be looking for volunteers to help with the next step filling in some key spots with native plants and more mulching.

## California's Drought Continues

Although we just had several weeks and inches of rain, many counties in California are still entering into the third year of a serious drought. San Jose Mayor Chuck Reed stated on September 21, 2009 in the San Jose City Council Chambers based on the inadequate structure and condition of the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta levees and available water that the Santa Clara County water situation is "teetering on catastrophe". As of the same date the California Department of Water Resources has reduced the 2010 Santa Clara Valley Water District expected allocation by 91.7%! In addition to the drastically reduced allocation, our current water stores are insufficient. Prior to the recent storms the ten county reservoirs are overall only 41.7% full. Lexington Reservoir serves as a dramatic example at 83.5% empty (Dave Lane, West Valley Green Leaf). Santa Clara Valley Water District is encouraging people to continue conservation efforts, and to reduce their water usage by 15% (<http://www.valleywater.org/programs/waterconservation.aspx>).

# COME GROW WITH US

The theme for this year's pledge drive sums up our goals at this moment in our history together: *Come Grow With US!*

Sunday, February 7, is the Kickoff Sunday for the pledge drive. The pledge total we receive during the following six weeks determines our budget for next fiscal year, 2010-2011. We are looking to each of our members and friends to continue to generously support this pledge drive.

We have achieved so much in the past several years and we are seeing the results of our efforts with interesting programs, vibrant music, provocative adult RE offers and many young families becoming part of our community. Let's continue growing!

The pledge goal, included in our Target budget for the fiscal year 2010/2011 drive is \$134,000. It was made in the context of our still uncertain economy and with a commitment to keep a tight rein on expenses, but to also continue support for our current programs that are so important to our community.

The only significant changes we have made from the budget that we approved for our current year is to allocate \$5,000 to start rebuilding our modest reserves which we have drawn down to meet expenses over the past few years, \$8,000 so we can again be paying our fair share to the UUA and PCD, and approximately \$2,000 to return our ministerial expense allocation to the contracted amount.

In order to avoid cutting into our key program expenses to develop a near-balanced budget for next year, we encourage all of us in to be as generous as we can be. Every pledge is going to count to allow us to maintain our good progress.

Come join us on Sunday, February 7<sup>th</sup> for a kickoff lunch immediately after the church service and a short presentation of our Target budget. Following the kickoff, all members and friends will be contacted either by letter or in person during February and asked to review your individual pledge to the church. We want this to be a growth year and we want you to "Come grow with us."

The nominating committee has begun the process of selecting nominees for the elected offices that will be voted upon at our annual meeting in May. The Board of Trustee offices that are up for election this year are: Secretary, Treasurer, Social Action trustee, RECCY trustee and Membership trustee.
