#### **A Mighty Wind**

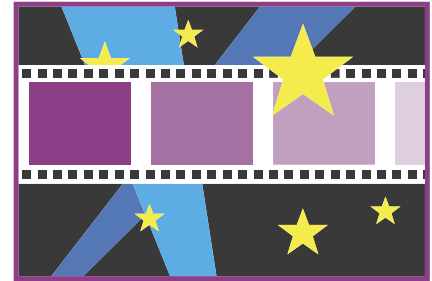
2003, PG-13, 92 minutes

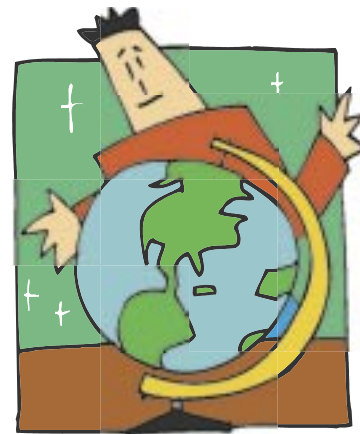

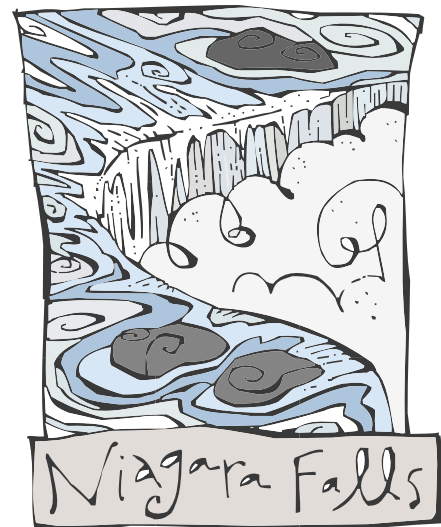
